



Modjeska Simkins Award

— for Civil Rights & Social Justice —



Description

This award was established to honor the spirit of Modjeska Monteith Simkins for her dedication to African-American public health reform, social reform and the Civil Rights Movement in South Carolina. The Modjeska Simkins Award recognizes an active individual who is committed to social justices within his or her community.

Criteria

To be considered for this award, the candidate must:

- Engage in activism for social or civil rights that advances the cause of human rights for South Carolinians
- Empower others and encourage independence
- Demonstrate leadership, creativity and integrity in the community
- Be from a political, public or business arena
- Be born in South Carolina or have adopted South Carolina as his or her residing state for a period of time
- Be 18 years or older

Nominating Process and Procedure

Nominations for the Modjeska Simkins Award must be submitted by **Feb. 29, 2016**. Anyone may nominate a candidate. The award recipient will be determined by the Modjeska Simkins Award Committee. Only one candidate per nomination form, but nominators can submit multiple nominations. In addition to completing and submitting the nomination form, nominators will be asked to include:

- A one-page summary explaining why their candidate is being nominated for the Modjeska Simkins Award
- Supporting documentation for the candidate
- Contact information

- Results and/or benefits of the activity/accomplishment (be specific and include documentation, if applicable, indicating results)

2. Provide a list of any publications or communications (books, articles, newspapers, TV shows, etc.) that the nominee wrote, organized, appeared on or to which the nominee contributed. Include source information (copies of the work, the website address where the work can be found online, or the bibliographic reference of the work).

3. You may include a maximum of 5 optional supporting attachments (newspaper and magazine articles, book reviews, award presentations, etc.) CDs are acceptable. Do not send audio or videotapes; however, you can refer to a website (provide the complete web address) that has audio/visual components.

4. Provide a list of any previous awards that pertain to the nominee's contribution to social or civil rights.
